IF you could rub a magic solution on your car windshield when you park it at night and wake up with a frost- and icefree windshield each morning, you wouldn't hesitate. With a simple combination of white vinegar and water, you'll have this magic.

MIX three parts white vinegar to one part tap water in a spray bottle. Keep the bottle in your car. In the evening when you come home for the night and park, spray a light mist all over the windshield and windows. The next morning you'll wake up to find you don't need to scrape anything. Your windows will be clear and ready for you to drive, according to the Vinegar Book website.

RUBBING alcohol mixed with water will melt ice on a windshield quickly. Mix two parts rubbing alcohol to one part water and pour it across the frozen windshield, according to the FC&A Publishing website. This will make it easy to scrape. In addition, using pure rubbing alcohol to clean your wiper blades on a regular basis should help keep ice from accumulating on them.
